









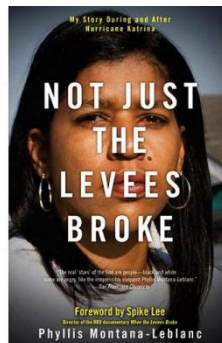

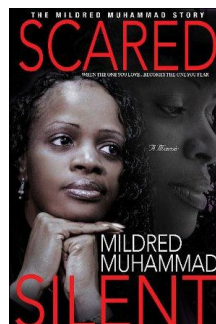

8:30 A.M. - 10:00 A.M.	<p><b>“Enterprise High School – An Unimaginable Tragedy”</b></p> <p>Mr. Rick Rainer, Principal Enterprise High School Enterprise, Alabama</p> <p>On March 1, 2007, an EF4 tornado struck the city of Enterprise. More than five hundred homes and businesses were damaged or destroyed but the most tragic of all was the destruction of Enterprise High School. Eight students lost their lives on that tragic day. Mr. Rainer brings insight, from a Principal’s perspective, in dealing with a crisis, both at the time of the event and during the recovery period. He also offers a practitioner’s view of the importance of being prepared to deal with a crisis. Rick Rainer is currently the Principal of Enterprise High School in Enterprise, Alabama.</p>

10:15 A.M. - 11:30 A.M.	<p><b>“Transportation Disaster Assistance and the NTSB”</b></p> <p>Ms. Deborah “Debi” Hall, LCSW, Coordinator of Victim Services National Transportation Safety Board Washington, DC</p> <p>Since joining the Board, she participated in the family assistance responses to the Minneapolis bridge collapse, general aviation accidents in Washington and Oregon as well as the collision of an Amtrak passenger train with a freight train in Chicago and the collision of a MetroLink and freight train in California. She also responded to the February 2009 aviation accident in Buffalo. Debi serves as the NTSB’s principal liaison with the headquarters of the American Red Cross to coordinate the provision of disaster mental health services to victims and families affected by transportation disasters.</p>

Riggins, LCSW, Executive Director Baldwin County Mental Health Center Fairhope, AL</p> <p>In addition to being the executive director of Baldwin County Mental Health Center, Ms. Riggins is a genuine social worker. When the Deepwater Horizon explosion and resulting oil spill threatened the environment and livelihood of those on Alabama’s Gulf Ms. Riggins began a near immediate proactive response to the potential and actual mental health needs of the most affected. Featured on various national television evening news programs, Ms. Riggins spent her mornings on the docks with the fishermen and women who saw their heritage, culture, and life’s work fade into a sea of dark crude.</p>	

<p>1:00 P.M. - 2:00 P.M.</p>	<p><b>“Scared Silent: The Ultimate Story of Survival from Trauma”</b></p> <p>Ms. Mildred Muhammad, Executive Director After the Trauma, Inc Prince Georges County, MD</p> <p>Ms. Muhammad has a unique connection to Montgomery, AL. Nearly a decade ago, her former husband and abuser led a misguided young man on a murderous rampage throughout the Washington, DC area. The first victims killed were ABC employees here in Montgomery, one killed and the other injured. John Allen Muhammad and Lee Boyd Malvo, the DC Snipers, would go on to kill 10 others and critically injure 3 in their plan to ultimately murder Ms. Muhammad. Domestic violence led to one of the most devastating mass causality events in our nation’s history, gripping 3 states and DC.</p>
